

Michael Dama: Was concerned about advertising vehicles being prohibited and asked if this would apply to the Dama Heating & Plumbing work trucks. Atty Calvert explained that this regulation should stay in place to keep flexibility in enforcement in situations where people purposely park vehicles with advertising on them for the sole purpose of advertising. This is what the ordinance is referring to. He said he doubted anyone would ever complain about the Dama vehicles, as they are not there for the basic purpose of advertising. He explained that the ordinance is trying to control the sign clutter, because when there are too many signs people don't even see them. The ordinance attempts to control the clutter, but in a manner that still allows businesses to advertise.

Ezra Gruszyinski: Asked about signs with flashing lights and whether or not bank signs would be prohibited. Atty Calvert explained that the bank signs that display the date, time, temperature and other messages would still be allowed under the amended ordinance. Reader board signs with actual flashing lights, or other signs with similar lights would not be allowed.

Pres. Deschane took a consensus of board members to see if the majority would want to vote on adoption of the ordinance at the subsequent board meeting, or would prefer to send the issue back to committee. 4 board members indicated they would like to vote on it at the meeting; 3 indicated they would like it to go back to committee.

It was noted that the issue of signs on recreational trails and the need to specify what length of time would be considered "temporary" would be referred back to committee for discussion as to future amendment of the ordinance.
